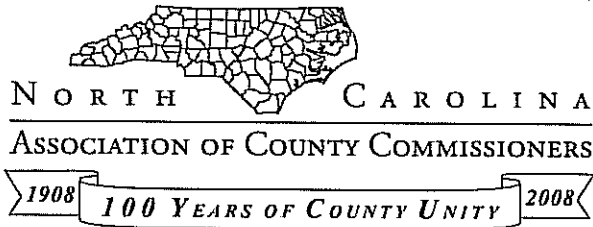

MINUTES
LENOIR COUNTY BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS
March 17, 2008

The Lenoir County Board of Commissioners met in regular session at 4:00 p.m. on Monday, March 17, 2008 in the Board of Commissioners Main Meeting Room in the Lenoir County Courthouse at 130 S. Queen St., Kinston, NC.

Members present: Chairman Paul Taylor; Vice-Chairman George Graham and Commissioners, Jackie Brown, Claude Davis, Earl Harper, Chris Humphrey, and Claude Stroud.

Members absent: None

Also present were: Michael W. Jarman, County Manager; Tommy Hollowell, Assistant County Manager; Robert Griffin, County Attorney; Lashanda Aytch, Clerk to the Board; and members of the general public and the news media.

Chairman Taylor called the meeting to order at approximately 4:00 p.m. Ms. Brown offered the invocation and Mr. Taylor led the audience in the pledge of allegiance.

Mr. Taylor congratulated Kinston High School on their NCHSAA 3A Division win in Chapel Hill, North Carolina. The Board invited the team to the April 21st meeting for a presentation.

ITEMS FROM THE COUNTY MANAGER

Item No. 2 was Items from the County Manager. Mr. Jarman stated that Premier Trailers has received a grant in the amount of \$174,137 for the North Carolina Rural Economic Development Center, Inc., for building reuse and restoration. Mr. Jarman stated Lenoir Community College would like to meet on April 21st at 6:00 p.m. to discuss budgetary issues. The Board unanimously agreed to the meeting date and time. County Administration met with Dr. Terry Cline and Diane Lynch of the Lenoir County School Board regarding budget issues. No formal request was made.

PROCLAMATION/BUDGET ORDINANCE AMENDMENT/RESOLUTIONS

Item No. 10 was a Proclamation for National Library Week in Lenoir County. Mr. Taylor read the Proclamation aloud for members of the Board and the viewing public. Upon a motion by Ms. Brown and a second by Mr. Stroud, Item No. 10 was unanimously approved.

Item No. 11 was a Budget Ordinance Amendment: General/E-911: Wireline Department: \$260,864: Increase. Mr. Hollowell stated the amendment is required to transfer the remaining Fund Balance of the E-911 Wireline Department, as of January 1, 2008, to the General Fund. This transfer is mandated by legislation passed in 2007 (Session Law 2007-383 House Bill 1755). The county may use these funds for any lawful purpose. In FY 04-05 the General Fund of Lenoir County loaned \$700,000 to the E-911 Fund to assist in the construction of a new communications center. Payback to the General Fund was set at \$140,000 per year for 5 years. Two payments of \$140,000 each were made in FY 06-07 and FY 07-08, applying this \$260,864 leaves a remaining balance of \$159,136. Upon a motion by Mr. Humphrey and a second by Ms. Brown, Item No. 11 was unanimously approved.

Item No. 12 was a Budget Ordinance Amendment: School Capital Fund: School Building: \$1,733,557: Increase. Mr. Hollowell stated the amendment is requested to set aside and budget funds for the future debt service on school bonds. In FY 06-07 it was determined that \$1,500,000 of sales tax revenues in the school capital fund each year would be necessary to help meet the debt requirements of a \$69,700,000 bond issue. These funds must be "housed" in the school capital fund until they are needed for debt payments. No funds were set aside in FY 06-07. In the FY 07-08 budget, \$1,266,443 was transferred to the General Fund for debt service on interest payments only. This amendment sets aside for future payments the \$1,500,000 for FY 06-07 and the remaining \$233,557 for FY 07-08. Upon a motion by Mr. Graham and a second by Ms. Brown, Item No. 12 was unanimously approved.

Item No. 13 was a Resolution Supporting the Relocation of the Railroad Crossing in the 70 West Industrial Park. Item was tabled for further information.

Item No. 14A was a Resolution Approving Purchase Order with Down East Protection Systems: \$2,918.28. Major Chis Hill, Lenoir County Sheriff's Department, addressed the Board. Major Hill stated beginning March 1, 2008 North Carolina State law requires that all in-custody interviews pursuant to a homicide investigation must be audio and video recorded. The Sheriff's Office currently uses a VCR to record interviews at the Sheriff's Office. Using VCR's and VCR tapes is an older technology that has long term storage limitations. Today's recording technology utilizes digital video recorders (DVR) which can store data for several days and allow the user to burn the data to a DVD. Several vendors produce various software packages and storage devices for these types of circumstances. Down East Protection Systems has supplied the Sheriff's Office with cameras and DVR's for the jail and courthouse for the past several years. Down East Protection Systems has recently supplied Jacksonville Police Department and the Onslow County Sheriff's Office with a DVR and camera system to record in-custody interviews. Down East Protection Systems has supplied the Sheriff's Office with a quote for an Everfocus DVR, dome camera, audio mounting kit, 14" monitor and installation for \$2918.28. The Sheriff intends to utilize State Controlled Substances drug funds to purchase the equipment. The Sheriff respectfully recommends that the Board of Commissioners approve the request to execute a purchase order with Down East Protection Systems to purchase the DVR and camera equipment. Upon a motion by Mr. Harper and a second by Mr. Stroud, Item No. 14A was unanimously approved.

Item No. 14B Resolution Approving Purchase Order with Dell: \$4,106.88. Major Hill stated the Sheriff's Office utilizes in-car cameras that are computer based. These cameras record images with audio both inside and outside the front of the patrol vehicle. All of the data is downloaded to a database/raid array. This database can be accessed at anytime so that the data (images) can be viewed and transferred to other storage devices such as CD's or DVD's. Recently the dedicated raid array failed and could not be repaired by technicians. The current raid array is out of warranty. As a result of the array's failure all in-car video recordings have been abruptly halted until the array is replaced. The current raid array has the capability to store 3 terra bytes of data. After speaking to Lenoir County's MIS director and technicians from IPT (International Police Technologies) it was determined that the replacement array should be a Dell NF500 Quad Core Xenon E5405 Processor. The State contract price for this device is \$4106.88. The Sheriff intends to use Federal Asset Forfeiture funds to purchase the device. The Sheriff respectfully recommends that the Board of Commissioners approve the request to execute a purchase order with Dell to purchase the processor. Upon a motion by Mr. Harper and a second by Mr. Stroud, Item No. 14B was unanimously approved.

Item No. 15A was a Resolution Authorizing the Approval of a Fireworks Show at the Kinston Indians Stadium on April 4, May 9, May 26, June 20, July 4, July 18, August 8 and August 22, 2008. Mr. Roger Dail, Emergency Services Director, addressed the Board. Mr. Dail stated the Board of Commissioners must approve all fireworks shows held within the county. All permits and contracts have been received for the show. Paperwork has been reviewed by the Lenoir County Fire Marshal and approved. Upon a motion by Mr. Graham and a second by Ms. Brown, Item No. 15A was unanimously approved.

Item No. 15B was a Resolution Authorizing the Purchase of Two Computers and Four Monitors from CDS for Mapping Hardware NTE: \$2,600. Mr. Dail stated The Lenoir County Emergency Services Department – Communications Division is in the process of upgrading mapping projects hardware in the Communications Center which will allow staff to provide optimum, effective dispatches to all emergency services personnel based on 911 calls for service. The purpose of two- (2) computers with a dual-card will allow two- (2) workstations to operate off the same computer, while utilizing individual (4) 19" monitors at each individual workstations. Upgrading the mapping project hardware in the Communications is necessary to perform the functions of dependable, reliable and efficient location of any and all 911 callers, either wire-line or wire-less caller, as well as providing the most efficient dispatch of the closest unit to the call for service. Upon a motion by Mr. Stroud and a second by Mr. Davis, Item No. 15B was unanimously approved.

Item No. 15C was a Resolution Authorizing the Approval of a Purchase Order for North Carolina Department of Corrections Enterprise Accounting Department: \$2,687.45. Mr. Dail stated the Lenoir County Emergency Services Department – Communications Division is the responsible department for ordering road signs and all items associated with the maintenance and upkeep of road signs for the County of Lenoir. This includes placing orders for all associated hardware needed for the placement of road signs for new roads, as well as replacing existing hardware that is no longer in place or is damaged beyond repair. The existence of up-to-date road signs is imperative in the assistance of emergency services personnel in locating citizens in need of emergency response. Upon a motion by Mr. Stroud and a second by Ms. Brown, Item No. 15C was unanimously approved.

Item No. 15D was a Resolution Authorizing the Purchase of a Microsoft SQL Server and License from CDS: NTE: \$3,315. Mr. Dail stated the Lenoir County Emergency Services Department – Communications Division is in the process of receiving a scheduled CAD software upgrade from VisionAir. However, VisionAir customer services has advised that the current Microsoft SQL Server, 7.0, is unable to support the Version 3.5 VisionAir software upgrade. In order to be able to support the latest upgrade, which will provide Lenoir County with up-to-date software to allow our CAD to run at an optimum level, we need to purchase Microsoft SQL 2005. Upon a motion by Mr. Stroud and a second by Ms. Brown, Item No. 15D was unanimously approved.

Item No. 15E was a Resolution Authorizing the Purchase of CAD EFD and EPD Interface Software from Visionair at a Cost of: \$11,940. The Lenoir County Emergency Services Department – Communications Division is currently utilizing a manual system for Emergency Fire Dispatch (EFD) and Emergency Police Dispatch (EPD) calls. We must purchase the CAD EFD and CAD EPD in order to interface with the Priority Dispatch EFD and EPD software. This will enable us to provide better service to the citizens of Lenoir County and provide a better quality assurance program for EFD and EPD compliance. Staff has evaluated both manual and computerized versions of the Priority Dispatch EFD and EPD programs. It has been determined that utilizing the computerized versions will benefit the citizens of Lenoir County for various reasons. The computerized versions allow the Telecommunicator to view a computer screen, asking all pertinent questions while inputting the correct responses. The computer will then assist the Telecommunication in dispatching the call correctly. The greatest benefit of purchasing these software programs is the increased efficiency, as well as the increased compliance with EFD and EPD calls. The monies for this purchase will come from the E911 “Special Emergency Telephone Fund”; therefore, will not impact the general fund. Upon a motion by Ms. Brown and a second by Mr. Stroud, Item No. 15E was unanimously approved.

Item No. 15F was a Resolution Authorizing the Purchase of Priority Dispatch Emergency Fire Dispatch (EFD) and Emergency Police Dispatch (EPD) Dispatching Software and Aqua Quality Management System at a NTE: \$53,000. Mr. Dail stated The Lenoir County Emergency Services Department – Communications Division will begin implementation of the automated Priority Dispatch Emergency Fire Dispatch and Emergency Police Dispatch system. This system will also allow the Communications Division to maintain the highest level of care on all dispatch disciplines that is currently available. The purchase of the EFD and EPD dispatching software and the AQUA quality management software, will allow the Communications Division to be able to service the citizens of Lenoir County in a more timely and accurate manner. The purchase of these two software packages includes the purchase of the software, installation of the software, as well as on-site training for the Communications Division personnel. The upgrade of the present EFD and EPD system is necessary to assist the Communications Division personnel in the performance of their duties as Emergency Fire Dispatchers and Emergency Police Dispatchers. This product cannot be bid out, due to it being vendor specific. Priority Dispatch is the only authorized dealer for this software package. Upon a motion by Mr. Davis and a second by Ms. Brown, Item No. 15F was unanimously approved.

Item No. 16 was Resolution Approving the Lenoir County Adoption Confidential Intermediary Fees for Services. Mr. Jack Jones, Department of Social Services Director, addressed the Board. Mr. Jones stated A change in the law, effective January 1, 2008, allows for licensed child-placing agencies to act as confidential intermediaries between adult adoptees, adult lineal descendants of a deceased adoptee, parents of adoptees under the age of 21, and biological parents. The Lenoir County Board of Social Services adopted an Adoption Confidential Intermediary Policy specifically for Lenoir County DSS at its December board meeting and that policy was amended at the January meeting to include policy for the 200% of poverty indigent population. This policy outlines the expected services, including:

- Provide initial consultation regarding Lenoir County’s policy in addressing the law regarding this service;
- Conduct an in-house record review and a search for the person including, but not limited to, an Internet based search;
- Initiate contact with any person found in an attempt to obtain current non-identifying health and background information; and/or
- Ascertain that person’s willingness to share identifying information or have contact with the applicant.
- Provide the intermediary services needed to ensure all parties are addressing the psychosocial issues in a healthy and productive manner.

The Confidential Intermediary (Lenoir County DSS) will provide counseling services or referral to appropriate counseling services for the original client if needed or requested by any party. The North Carolina General Statute states that the fees to be charged are based upon a plan recommended by the county director of social services and subject to the approval of the local board of social services and the board of county commissioners. In no event is the fee charged to exceed the cost to the board of social services. If counseling services are provided by the Confidential Intermediary, they will be provided by written agreement on a fee scale agreed upon by the agency and the individual receiving the services. An initial deposit of \$250 is applied to the actual costs of services. The hourly rate of services can fluctuate monthly depending upon the agency's cost of the Confidential Intermediary in a particular month. Upon a motion by Ms. Brown and a second by Mr. Stroud, Item No. 16 was unanimously approved.

Item No. 17A was a Resolution Authorizing Lenoir County Health Department to Execute Purchase Orders to Glaxo Smith Kline Pharmaceuticals (\$6,000) and Theracom Pharmaceuticals (\$4,000). Mr. Joey Huff, Health Director, addressed the Board. Mr. Huff stated the requested utilization of funds is based on projected expenditures for hepatitis vaccine and contraceptives/medications required in the Family Planning Program. Upon a motion by Mr. Humphrey and a second by Mr. Graham, Item No. 17A was unanimously approved.

Item No. 17B was a Resolution Authorizing the Lenoir County Health Department to Execute a Purchase Order Contract to Vic Bailey Ford, Inc.: \$14,148. Mr. Huff stated the Health Department would like to use state funding to purchase a 2008 Ford F150 Regular Cab Pickup Truck to replace the vehicle presently used in the Animal Control Program. The vehicle to be replaced is a 2000 model and has in excess of 183,000 miles. The vehicle has had frequent and costly repairs averaging 25,000 miles per year. The new vehicle will have a 36,000-mile warranty. Upon a motion by Ms. Brown and a second by Mr. Harper, Item No. 17B was unanimously approved.

Item No. 18 was a Resolution Approving Acceptance and Execution of Contract for Independent Audit Services per Proposal dated February 20, 2008: Fiscal Year 2007-2008: \$38,700. Mr. Hollowell stated on March 17, 2003, the Board accepted a proposal from the certified public accounting firm of Pittard, Perry, & Crone, Inc. of LaGrange, N.C., to conduct the annual financial audit of Lenoir County for Fiscal Year 02-03 at a cost of \$33,500; Fiscal Year 03-04 at a cost of \$34,500; and Fiscal Year 04-05 at a cost of \$35,500. Pittard, Perry, and Crone's proposal represented the lowest cost to the County of all proposals submitted. The County contracted with Pittard, Perry, & Crone, Inc., again to conduct the Fiscal Year 05-06 audit at a cost of \$36,600 and again to conduct the Fiscal Year 06-07 audit at a cost of \$37,600. A new contract must be executed each year and submitted to the Local Government Commission for their approval. Pittard, Perry, & Crone, Inc. has agreed to prepare the annual audit for Fiscal Year 07-08 with a cost of living increase of 2.9%. Pittard, Perry, & Crone, Inc. has been the County's auditor for over 14 years and is well qualified to conduct the County's audit in compliance with all governmental accounting standards. Upon a motion by Ms. Brown and a second by Mr. Davis, Item No. 18 was unanimously approved.



LENOIR COUNTY BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS
BUDGET PLANNING WORKSESSION
Administration Building Conference Room
February 18, 2008

The Lenoir County Board of Commissioners began their scheduled retreat on Monday, February 18, 2008 at 1:00 p.m., at the Administration Building Conference Room, 101 North Queen St., Kinston, NC.

Members present included: Chairman Paul H. Taylor, Jr., and Commissioners Claude Davis, Earl Harper, and Claude Stroud. Members absent: Jackie Brown, George W. Graham, Jr., Chris Humphrey

Also present were: Michael W. Jarman, County Manager, Tommy Hollowell, Assistant County Manager, and Lashanda Aytch, Clerk to the Board

Mr. Jarman welcomed the Board to the retreat and gave an overview of the retreat agenda. Mr. Jarman then highlighted the accomplishments of each department for 2007.

Goals / Expectations of Board Members / Budget Philosophy

The Board reviewed the Financial/Budget Philosophy to see if any changes were needed. The current philosophy concerning Unrestricted/Unreserved General Fund Fund Balance is to maintain a Twenty Percent (20%) Minimum Level of General Fund Expenditures. Mr. Stroud stated he did not feel the Fund Balance should remain at Twenty Percent (20%); the county currently stands at 17%, which is \$8,723,521, approximately 6.7 weeks of working capital. Mr. Jarman reminded the Board they must be very careful when determining what minimum to maintain.

Mr. Harper asked about the status of the mental health building. Mr. Jarman stated no one has offered the minimum amount of \$2 million the Board agreed on for the property. In recent meetings it has been determined the mental health system is failing; some mental health services may be reverted back to the county. With this in mind, it may be appropriate to keep the building for future county use. In recent discussions with EastPointe Board members, they have requested to lease the building from the county. EastPointe has agreed to place a roof on the building at a cost of \$70,000 and handle all maintenance of the building. The cost of the lease will be \$100,000 per year for three (3) years with the option to renew after (3) years. Board members agreed with the proposal as presented.

Mr. Harper asked if the Sales Tax Referendum would be presented to the citizens this year. Mr. Jarman stated he would like to offer this referendum to the citizens once more, but with more education offered to the public. Mr. Stroud agreed that more education/information would be needed to obtain a positive outcome. Mr. Stroud stated the citizens needed to understand what they are voting for and how it would benefit the county. Mr. Taylor stated he was in full support of the sales tax referendum.

Health Insurance Fund

Mr. Hollowell stated the county has not experienced very high insurance claims to date. If claims stay on their current path, the county will be in good condition. The Board discussed briefly about providing insurance to retired workers; no decision was made.

Building / Facility Utilization

King Street Facility-Mr. Joe Testino of NC Probation and Parole will be occupying the front of the building with Juvenile Probation services. Lenoir County Transit will occupy the back of the building providing the county transit services. Renovation on the building will be complete by June 2008.

MIS - Personnel have vacated MIS facility -- voting machines are now being stored in the building.

Gordon Street Facility -- County Administration wants direction for the future of the building. The building is in poor condition, but could be used as a storage facility if needed by other departments. The Board members directed administration to sale or demolish the building.

Deep Run Sewer -- Mr. Joe Bower of White and Allen, is working on obtaining the easement for the Town of Pink Hill. The Town is expected to take over sewer services on April 1, 2008.

Deep Run EMS Facility -- The new EMS building is in place, other construction within the building as begun; property will be a welcomed addition to the community.

Jail -- Mr. Hollowell reviewed jail configurations and numbers with the Board. Board members wanted to table the issue for further discussion at a future budget retreat.

Board members agreed to hold the next budget retreat on March 17th at 2:00 p.m.

The Lenoir County Board of Commissioners began their scheduled retreat on Monday, March 17, 2008 at 2:00 p.m., at the Resource Development Building, 101 North Queen St., Kinston, NC.

Members present included: Chairman Paul H. Taylor, Jr., George W. Graham, Jr., Vice-Chairman and Commissioners Jackie Brown, Claude Davis, Earl Harper, Chris Humphrey and Claude Stroud.

Members absent: None

Also present were: Michael W. Jarman, County Manager, Tommy Hollowell, Assistant County Manager, and Lashanda Aytch, Clerk to the Board

Ms. Brown offered the invocation. Mr. Jarman welcomed everyone to the second budget retreat. Mr. Jarman stated he felt the "Wake up Lenoir" meeting went very well despite the articles that had been reported. Mr. Jarman stated he as well as Mr. Scott Stevens, City of Kinston Manager, planned together for the event and made a joint presentation. Mr. Taylor stated he found the meeting to be very educational for all in attendance.

Jail Overcrowding/Construction Issues

Mr. Jarman reminded the Board of the jail average daily capacity of the Lenoir County Jail. Capacity at times has swelled over the 121 legal capacity with an average of 140 inmates. Mr. Jarman stated county administration was in need of input from the Board in order to move forward with jail construction. County Administration is in full agreement of constructing a new jail facility. If the Board commits to a jail project now, there will be a limited amount of debt, but engineering cost would be budgeted for this fiscal year. Debt service on the project would come in 2009, during revaluation.

Mr. Harper asked about the status of the new programs (i.e., electronic monitoring, in-house drug testing, and court liaison) to see how effective they have been in combating the jail capacity levels. Mr. Jarman stated the programs are good programs, but the jail is still over capacity; the programs do not reduce the numbers enough to completely control the jail capacity.

Mr. Stroud asked if the expense is necessary for a capacity of only 140 inmates. Mr. Jarman stated the capacity has been over 140 inmates for several years; the county can not plan for just the needs of today, but for the next five-(5) years and beyond. There is still a need for bed space; there is no decrease in criminal activity.

Mr. Harper stated he has looked into the possibility of building a two story 50-bed facility adjacent to the current jail. This would give the jail a capacity of 170 beds. Mr. Harper stated it would cost the county less in construction costs and operating expenses. Mr. Taylor stated he has visited the jail on several occasions, even at night, and the jail is in horrible condition, which puts the lives of not only the inmates but also the jailers of Lenoir County in danger. Mr. Harper stated all options must be explored before considering a \$9-\$12 million jail construction.

Mr. Humphrey asked how would the county pay for the jail construction. Mr. Jarman stated there is not enough information at this time to determine where the monies will come from. Last year, the sales tax increase was proposed as an option to construct the jail facility and was defeated. This year the State budgeted Medicaid relief for counties. For Lenoir County the figure is \$2 million, but that has yet to be seen; therefore property taxes are the only other source in collecting the revenues needed to build a new facility.

Mr. Harper stated he wants to know the daily number of inmates for the past 60 days. Major Chris Hill of the Lenoir County Sheriff's Department, stated he would provide the information. Mr. Hill stated the Court Liaison position has been working very well along with electronic monitoring. The liaison releases non-violent offenders for the electronic monitoring program, but there are several inmates that have to stay in jail under court order. Mr. Hill stated the Sheriff's Department is looking into switching to a cellular electronic monitoring program. Instead of having a landline, the machine connects to a cellular tower, which will cost a few dollars more, but could be more convenient. Mr. Hill stated he does not agree with building a 50-bed facility. A facility of that nature would only take care of the county's short-term needs stated Mr. Hill.

Mr. Jarman asked what is the direction the Board wishes to take for jail space. Mr. Taylor stated the issue must be discussed and a determination rendered now. Mr. Graham stated the North Carolina Facility Services evaluated the jail last year and the county received a poor report. The county is going to pay by being sued for loss of life or other issues in the jail. The county has an obligation to take care of the inmates because they are citizens of Lenoir County. The county jail is an inadequate facility, if the jail is built properly the county could possibly reduce the amount of employees in the jail. A decision has to be made now.

Mr. Taylor asked should the county build a 108 or a 144-bed facility. Mr. Jarman stated a 108-bed facility was the first recommendation rendered by Sheriff Smith. Mr. Jarman asked the Board what other information is needed and who do they need it from in order to render a decision. Mr. Hill stated it comes down to how far in the future does the Board want to take the county as far as jail needs. Mr. Harper stated he would like more information before rendering a decision. Mr. Hill asked what other information is needed that has not already been produce to make a decision. Mr. Harper stated there is a lot of unknown information that the Board does not have in order to make a decision. Mr. Jarman stated the decision has to be made as to whether a jail facility is needed, and how will it be paid for. Mr. Graham stated the Board should authorize the county manager to proceed with construction planning, if not their will not be a decision made.

Mr. Jarman stated the county should expect to spend at least \$100,000 on the construction design of the jail. Mr. Stroud stated the County needs to wait until the revaluation is done before making a decision regarding the jail. Mr. Harper agreed with Mr. Stroud. Mr. Graham stated the Board couldn't continue to procrastinate regarding this issue, the Board is stuck on this issue. Mr. Graham stated the Board needs to decide on pre-construction issues now. Mr. Harper stated an additional 200-bed facility should be constructed instead of a 144-bed facility. The later would be a waste of money for the citizens of Lenoir County. Mr. Taylor stated that increase in beds would be a significant impact on the budget for construction of the jail. No Commissioner had an objection to the increase in beds for the new jail facility. Upon a motion by Ms. Brown and a second by Mr. Graham, the Board approved county administration to proceed with construction design, financing, and planning for a 200-bed jail facility not to exceed \$100,000. The motion was approved by a 6-1 vote with Mr. Humphrey dissenting.

HISTORY / BACKGROUND:

The Sheriff's Office is charged with enforcing the laws of North Carolina as well as investigating crimes that have occurred. The Sheriff has a budgeted line for special investigative expenses which are primarily used to pay informants for information related to drug activity or for other criminal activity or to purchase narcotics in undercover operations. Currently, county policy regulates the withdrawal of funds to \$2500 without Board consent.

EVALUATION:

On a number of occasions investigators have requested funds from the special investigation expense line which exceeds the \$2500 cap. This limitation hinders the investigation because the funds are not available until the board has approved the expenditure. Narcotics investigations typically involve the purchase of illicit narcotics that exceed \$2500, depending upon the nature of the case. In addition, these cases are unpredictable requiring funds to be available at any given time. The Sheriff is requesting that the funds in the Special Investigations Expense line be fully available for use, without board consent.

The Sheriff respectfully recommends that the Board of Commissioners approve the request to permit the Sheriff to deviate from the county policy concerning fund expenditures, allowing the Sheriff to withdraw any amount of funds within the Special Investigations Expense line without board approval.

SUBJECT AREA: Financial

ACTION REQUESTED:

The Board is requested to authorize the Sheriff to execute a purchase order with Gately Communication, Co., for the purchase of (14) Gateway S-7220M computers (Mobile Data Terminals) and the associated equipment and services (mount, base, tilt/swivel attachment, programming, installation).

HISTORY / BACKGROUND:

Mobile Data Terminals (MDT's) are laptop type in-car computer terminals that are seated in a mount and are connected to a modem. The MDT allows the officer to enter and receive live data from various state and national databases such as the North Carolina Department of Motor Vehicles and the National Crime Information Center (NCIC). Having this ability the officer can access vehicle registration information and determine the owner of the vehicle, his or her address, insurance information, lien holder data, registration status, etc. The MDT (after accessing a state or national database) can inform the officer if the vehicle or person is wanted as well as other important information. Currently the Sheriff's Office has several MDT's which have been in operation for over 10 years. These MDT's are becoming non-functional and the expense of repairing these older MDT's is not financially feasible. The minimum service cost for an older MDT is \$500.

EVALUATION:

A number of companies provide computers for law enforcement purposes. Gateway laptops have been sold to a number of law enforcement agencies in North Carolina. These agencies were contacted and it was found that they were very satisfied with this computer. Gately Communications, Co. is currently being used by the Sheriff's Office for its communications needs. Gately Communications, Co., provided a price of \$1330.79 per laptop as well as \$527.38 for the associated equipment and services for a total of \$1,858.17, plus shipping. The Sheriff intends to purchase the MDT's from civil process service fees, which may be used to enhance the service of civil process. The Sheriff respectfully recommends that the Board of Commissioners approve the request to purchase (14) Gateway computers, model S-7220M, and the associated equipment and services from Gately Communications, Co.
