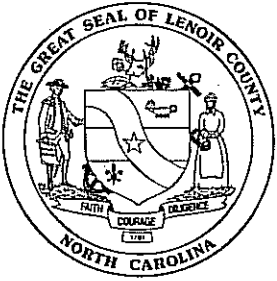

Re: Submitting of the proposed 2009 Reappraisal Schedule of Values and timeline for
adopting the Schedule of Values

Date: October 1, 2008

Below is a recommended timeline for adopting the uniform schedules of values, standards, and rules to be used in appraising real property in Lenoir County for the 2009 revaluation. This timeline adheres to the legal requirements set forth in NC General Statute 105-317: Appraisal of real property; adoption of schedules, standards, and rules.

OCTOBER 6, 2008 – SUBMIT PROPOSED SCHEDULE OF VALUES

Upon receipt of the proposed schedules, standards, and rules, the Board of Commissioners shall publish a statement in the newspaper stating the schedules have been submitted to the Board of County Commissioners and are available for public inspection in the Tax Assessor's office. The published statement shall also include the time and place of a public hearing on the proposed schedules, standards and rules.

OCTOBER 20, 2008 – PUBLIC HEARING ON THE PROPOSED SCHEDULES, STANDARDS, AND RULES

The public hearing must be held at least seven days before adopting the final schedules, standards and rules.

NOVEMBER 3, 2008 – RESOLUTION REQUESTING THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS TO ISSUE AN ORDER ADOPTING THE SCHEDULES, STANDARDS AND RULES.

Notice of this order shall be published once a week for four (4) successive weeks in the newspaper. Notice shall state that the Schedules have been adopted and are open to examination and that property owners have 30 days from the date the first notice was published to appeal to the Property Tax Commission.

DECEMBER 4, 2008 – LAST DAY PROPERTY OWNER MAY APPEAL THE SCHEDULES, STANDARDS, AND RULES TO THE PROPERTY TAX COMMISSION. *(IF FIRST NOTICE DATE WAS 11/03/08)*

LENOIR COUNTY VETERANS SERVICE OFFICER

JUSTIFICATION

The implementation of a new Department, Lenoir County Veterans Affairs Office would employ a staff of two people, a County Veterans Service Officer (CVSO) and one Personnel Assistant (PA). **{The PA position is already funded}**

We feel that now is the appropriate time for Lenoir County to seriously consider funding this position, County Veterans Service Officer. The justification lies in the facts that Lenoir County is on the precept of a major influx of veterans and dependents with the coming of recently secured industries, e.g. Sanderson & Spirit to Lenoir County and others that are in the pipeline.

For years, the North Carolina Division of Veterans Affairs District Office located in Lenoir County has tried to provide needed services to veterans of the county and their dependents. However, the duties of the District Office will be expanding with the coming of the NC Veterans Nursing Home to Lenoir County and increase in veterans population in counties serviced by District 2 of the North Carolina Division of Veterans Affairs.

Currently, the two District Officers attempt to provide services to veterans in the county, visit other offices within their district (Jones, Duplin, Craven, Pamlico, Greene, Carteret) on regular weekly basis providing training, assisting with leadership issues, and assisting with unusual cases. Additionally, they work with County Managers and commissioners in these counties when there are vacancies to be filled.

With the potential increase of veterans moving into Lenoir County, along with new industries arriving, we feel that the time required to service Lenoir County veterans

will be shortened or missed inadvertently. Also, North Carolina is only one of two states in the union to increase in veterans population, Tennessee the other.

Currently there is not a District Officer reporting veterans activities in Lenoir County to the County Manager/Commissioners monthly. The District Office in Lenoir County has little or no working relationships with county veteran service organizations and no active working relationship with civic groups to promote veterans holiday's under the auspice of their current workload. A final issue that lacks activity is the routine contacting of local businesses on a regular basis that are directly impacted by Lenoir County veterans benefits.

In conclusion, we feel that the development of a County Veteran Affairs Office In Lenoir County would help improve the services to veterans and their dependents and be more consistent with regular follow-ups. We would assure veterans that even with increased industry and population in the county, the veterans and their dependents would be serviced daily on a walk-in basis. This department would be involved with all service organizations in the county, local civic groups and be in and out of merchants businesses in Lenoir County on a regular basis.

It is obvious that a newly assigned County Department of Veteran Affairs with a County Veterans Service Officer and Personnel Assistant in Lenoir County will be a win-win situation for the county and the veterans.

LENOIR COUNTY JOB DESCRIPTION

JOB TITLE: County Veteran Service Officer
Veteran Service Department

GENERAL STATEMENT OF JOB

Under minimal supervision, performs administrative work of the County Veteran Service Office. Employee is responsible for providing service and representation to veterans, their dependents, and survivors with new and reopened claims and appeals to the U.S. Department of Veteran Affairs.

Duties include interviewing clients, advising and counseling clients of entitlements under various Federal and State laws, medical and legal research, preparation of claims, review of Department of Veteran Affairs (DVA) rating decisions, composition of appeals, and transmitting correspondence to appropriate officials. The County Veteran Service Officer (CVSO) must manage each case while maintaining a working relationship with the claimant. Work includes answering telephones, greeting veterans and/or dependents, preparing visitor and telephone log, and maintaining tangible files of veterans. The CVSO must receive National Accreditation from the General Counsel of the United States to represent veterans, widows, widowers, dependents and children. The County Veteran Service Officer will supervise one employee. The Lenoir County Veteran Service Department of will be managed by the Lenoir County Manager.

Continual education and training is critical to keep informed on the latest changes in DVA policies, procedures, regulations and recent precedent decisions from the U.S. Court of Appeals for veteran claims. Education is received by attendance at NCDVA DSO Schools, N.C. Association of CVSO Conferences, National Association of CVSO Conferences, and Department of Veterans Affairs Seminars.

SPECIFIC DUTIES AND RESPONSIBILITIES

- Greet visitors, answers telephone and handle correspondence.
- Interview veterans and their dependents providing information and direct assistance/representation with new and reopened claims concerning matters of burial, compensation, education, health care, insurance, loans pensions, etc.
- Selects, develops and prepares proper applications and obtains documents, medical records, and affidavits as evidence of proof of entitlements for submission to the U.S. Department of Veterans Affairs.
- Reviews all U.S. Department of Veterans Affairs rating decisions for correctness according to current regulations.
- Researches and prepares appeals to the U.S. Board of Veterans Affairs.
- Works closely with all local businesses to include funeral homes, banks, military units, etc.
- Maintain a variety of tangible veteran/dependent files, to include a diary system for management of each claim.
- Maintain records of potentially eligible dependent children for the NCDVA Scholarship Program, assisting such with application to the NCDVA during their senior year of high school.
- Act as a strong advocate for the veteran to secure medical benefits from VAMC.

COUNTY VETERAN SERVICE OFFICER

ADDITIONAL JOB FUNCTIONS

- Prepares and manages annual budget for the Veterans Service Department.
- Visit and work with all service organizations.
- Be an active working participant in the Annual Veterans Day ceremonies.
- Speak on behalf of veteran issues using newspaper, radio/TV as available.
- Report Annual Assessment of Veterans benefits to Lenoir County Manager and Commissioners.
- Perform other related work as required.

MINIMUM TRAINING AND EXPERIENCE

Bachelor degree and a minimum of two years of related veterans experience or accreditation by the National Association of County Veterans Service Officers and /or the North Carolina Division of Veterans Affairs.

SPECIAL RECOMMENDATIONS

Non-accredited Service Officer must obtain accreditation from the North Carolina Division of Veterans Affairs within one year and obtain accreditation from the National Association of County Veterans Service Officers within two years. U.S Department of Veterans Affairs' TRIP certification should be obtained within one year.

Continual education and training through the NCDVA DSO schools, NC Association of CVSO Conferences, National Association of CVSO Conferences and the U.S. DVA seminars is required.

KNOWLEDGE, SKILLS AND ABILITIES

Extensive knowledge of Federal and State laws pertaining to veterans' benefits available through the US Department of Veterans Affairs and the North Carolina Division of Veterans Affairs.

Extensive knowledge of the various procedures, applications and forms used in applying for veterans benefits.

Considerable layman knowledge of various disabilities common to veterans.

Considerable knowledge of office equipment, procedures and standard clerical skills.

General knowledge of where and procedures for obtaining public documents in North Carolina, other states and foreign countries.

General knowledge of community organizations, agencies and facilities related to veterans affairs.

Skills in organizing work flow and coordinating activities.

Skills in the usage of office equipment including computers, typewriters, copiers, adding machines, etc.

Management background.

Ability to interview, obtaining maximum information available to ascertain proper benefits for the client.

Ability to exercise tact, courtesy and discretion in frequent contact with clients, veterans, and veteran program officials.

Ability to research and interpret and apply obscure federal laws, state laws and current law cases.

Ability to handle independently all communications.

Ability to work without close supervision.

Ability to maintain effective files and records and prepare reports for monthly briefs.

Ability to establish and maintain effective working relationships as necessary with all inter-agencies.

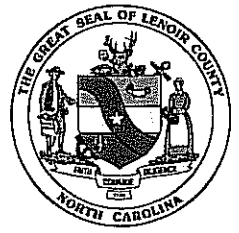





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On July 11, 2008 the Lenoir County ABC Board held its monthly meeting. With all members present Chairman Stroud called the meeting to order. The minutes of the prior month were approved as read.

As the initial order of business Mr. Hill distributed sales reports for the month of June 2008. Following a review of these statements the Board made note of the decrease in sales comparing June 2008 to June 2007. The Board also took note of the significant increase in sales comparing the years ending June 30, 2008 to June 30, 2007.

Next Mr. Hill informed the Board that the contract with Design Plus Store Fixtures Inc. of Monroe, NC for the remodeling of Store #One located at 110 South Herritage Street had been executed. Mr. Hill stated that the remodeling process would start around the middle of August 2008 and would take approximately two weeks. The Board instructed Mr. Hill to take the appropriate measures necessary to accomodate the closing of Store #One during these two weeks.


Next Mr. Hill informed the Board that the first step in the installation process of the new cash register system for the Lenoir County ABC Stores and the new computer system for the Lenoir County ABC Board Office would begin around the end of August 2008. Mr. Hill stated that the entire process would take approximately three months.

Next Mr. Hill informed the Board that the Program Evaluation Division of the General Assembly had notified all ABC Boards that a survey in connection with their evaluation of the effectiveness of the ABC system in North Carolina would be sent out at the end of July 2008. Following a brief discussion the Board instructed Mr. Hill to complete the survey as soon as possible once it had been received.

As the final order of business the Board considered salary adjustment for its employees. Following a lengthy discussion the Board decided to give all full-time and part-time employees a 3% cost of living increase as well as a \$200 per year salary bonus to all full-time employees and a \$100 per year salary bonus to all part-time employees. The Board instructed Mr. Hill to make these salary adjustments effective July 1, 2008.

With no further business at hand Chairman Stroud adjourned the July meeting.

MINUTES
LENOIR COUNTY BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS
September 15, 2008

The Lenoir County Board of Commissioners met in regular session at 4:00 p.m. on Monday, September 15, 2008 in the Board of Commissioners Main Meeting Room in the Lenoir County Courthouse at 130 S. Queen St., Kinston, NC.

Members present: Chairman Paul Taylor and Commissioners, Jackie Brown, Claude Davis, Earl Harper, Chris Humphrey, and Claude Stroud.

Members absent: Vice-Chairman George Graham

Also present were: Michael W. Jarman, County Manager; Tommy Hollowell, Assistant County Manager; Robert Griffin, County Attorney; Martha Martin, Finance Officer; Lashanda Aytch, Clerk to the Board; and members of the general public and the news media.

Chairman Taylor called the meeting to order at approximately 4:00 p.m. Ms. Brown offered the invocation and Mr. Taylor led the audience in the pledge of allegiance.

Upon a motion by Ms. Brown and a second by Mr. Harper, Mr. Graham was excused from the meeting due to a FEMA mission.

PUBLIC INFORMATION

Ms. Catharine Kosinski presented the Board information regarding Disability Awareness. Ms. Kosinski stated the title of her project is "Access Lenoir." Ms. Kosinski hopes to show resources that are available to people with disabilities. Ms. Kosinski stated she wanted to do this project due to an accident she was in five (5) years ago when she was forced to use a wheelchair for several months. Ms. Kosinski stated her goals are to increase public awareness through a Disability Resource Fair on October 15, 2008 at Vernon Park Mall, complete her projects with Ministries of Mercy to build wheelchair ramps for disabled citizens in Lenoir County, and finally to make access to public buildings around the city and county more accessible for the disabled. Ms. Kosinski hopes the Commissioners look to increase signage regarding ramps and wheelchair lifts around the courthouse, and research having automatic doors installed as well. The Board thanked Ms. Kosinski for her presentation.

The 2009 Re-appraisal Schedule of Values was tabled for further information.

ITEMS FROM THE CHAIRMAN/COMMISSIONERS

Mr. Taylor stated the Groundbreaking Ceremony for Spirit AeroSystems went very well today; Mr. Taylor stated he is looking forward to the construction process. Mr. Jarman stated the event was very well attended; the county is very excited about having Spirit in Lenoir County.

Mr. Harper stated the Day Reporting Center had five (5) new graduates this past week. The program is doing very well.

Ms. Brown updated the Board on expenditures of the Department of Social Services.

ITEMS FROM THE COUNTY MANAGER

Item No. 2 was Items from the County Manager. No items to review.

CONSENT AGENDA

Upon a motion by Ms. Brown and a second by Mr. Davis, the Board unanimously approved the Consent Agenda:

- B.** Budget Ordinance Amendment: Trust & Agency Fund: Extension – Family Caregiver: \$7,666: Increase
- 6. Budget Ordinance Amendment: General Fund: Finance/Sheriff: \$4,000: Increase Jarman/Martin

BUDGET ORDINANCE AMENDMENT/RESOLUTIONS

Item No. 7 was a Budget Ordinance Amendment: General Fund: Process Funds: \$20,000: Increase. Mr. Hollowell stated the Amendment sets up a pass through account for the Floodplain Mapping Fee. The 2008 North Carolina General Assembly enacted Session Law 2008-107 that amended G.S. 161-10 to increase the registration fee for deeds of trust and mortgages. This fee will be collected by Register of Deeds and forwarded to the North Carolina Department of Crime Control and Public Safety to offset the cost of floodplain mapping by the State. This new legislation will be effective October 1, 2008. Upon a motion by Mr. Humphrey and a second by Mr. Stroud, Item No. 7 was unanimously approved.

Item No. 8A was a Budget Ordinance Amendment: General Fund: DSS: \$34,681: Increase. Mr. Chris Harper, Family Support Program Manager addressed the Board. The amendment reflects a line item adjustment to reflect increase and/or decrease in allocations. No County funds required. Upon a motion by Mr. Harper and a second by Ms. Brown, Item No. 8A was unanimously approved.

Item No. 8B was a Resolution Requesting Appointment of the Planning Committee for the Lenoir County Work First Block Grant Plan for SFY 2010-2011. As State Law mandates, all counties must submit a county Work First Block Grant Plan to the Department of Health and Human Services for Work First biennial planning. This is an opportunity for counties to take full advantage of the local flexibility structure in the Work First Program. The planning process consists of several significant criteria. Those criteria include the designation of county status, the planning committee, the county plan model, public comment, and the primary contact designee.

North Carolina General Statute 108.27 and Work First Policy Section 103 provide guidelines for the appointment of a Welfare Reform planning committee. The required committee stakeholders include:

- County Board of Social Services
 - Board of Local Management Entity
 - Local public health board
 - Local school system
 - Business community
 - Board of County Commissioners
- Community based organizations

North Carolina General Statute 108.27 and Work First Policy Section 103 provide instructions for the development of the local Work First plan to meet local needs. The individuals selected for the Work First Planning Committee are very familiar with the Work First Program, the targeted population, and the planning process. Upon a motion by Mr. Harper and a second by Ms. Brown, Item No. 8B was unanimously approved.

Item No. 9 was a Resolution Authorizing Lenoir County Health Department to Execute a Purchase Order to C & W Electronics, Inc.: \$4,420. Mr. Joey Huff, Health Director addressed the Board. Mr. Huff stated the CO2 incubator is used by laboratory staff to culture clinical specimens for medical staff to make diagnosis and determine the most effective treatment. The current CO2 incubator has been in operation since March 1996, and is unable to be used due to a bad temperature sensor. Upon a motion by Mr. Davis and a second by Ms. Brown, Item No. 9 was unanimously approved.

Item No. 10 was a Resolution Authorizing Blanket Purchase Order: Squires Auto Generator & Starter Service: \$5,000. Mr. Hollowell stated the Lenoir County Transit System operates a fleet of approximately 12 vehicles. The Transit System utilizes local vendors for maintenance and repairs to its vehicles. Squires Auto Generator & Starter Service is a local vendor with many years of experience and is able to perform many of the repairs required for Transit Vehicles. Upon a motion by Ms. Brown and a second by Mr. Stroud, Item No. 10 was unanimously approved.

Item No. 11 was a Resolution Authorizing Painting of District Criminal Courtroom in the Lenoir County Courthouse: Creech's Painting, Inc.: \$6,270. Mr. Mike Wiggins, Maintenance Coordinator, addressed the Board. Mr. Wiggins stated The Lenoir County Courthouse addition was constructed in 1982-1983. The interior of the District Courtrooms has not been painted since that time. Medallions on the walls behind the Judge's benches have loosened and begun to fall. Water damage to ceilings has not been sealed and painted. The walls have become dirty and the existing paint has been rubbed off in places while trying to clean them. The current condition of the interior of the District Courtrooms does not present a favorable image for the County. Administration wishes to repair and paint the District Courtrooms one at a time in an effort to disrupt the legal proceedings as little as possible. The District Criminal Courtroom is in the worst condition and will be first on the repair and paint list. The County Maintenance Department received three (3) bids to clean, repair, and paint the interior of the Criminal District Courtroom in the Lenoir County Courthouse. Creech's Painting, Inc. of Kinston, N.C. provided the County with the lowest bid to perform the work as specified. Upon a motion by Mr. Stroud and a second by Ms. Brown, Item No. 11 was unanimously approved.

Item No. 12 was a Resolution Approving Engineering Services Geotechnical and Phase I Environmental Reports on Parking Lots for Proposed Jail Construction: Froehling & Robertson, Inc. and KCI Associates: \$6,815. Mr. Hollowell stated on August 4, 2008, the Board approved a 90-day option-to-purchase agreement on lots adjacent to the Lenoir County Courthouse for proposed jail construction. Before exercising the option-to-purchase agreement, the County must determine if the lots are suitable for construction of a jail facility. Geotechnical reports may include, but are not limited to, description of proposed construction and anticipated structural loads, site subsurface conditions, soil borings, test pits, groundwater conditions, requirements for fill/backfill, foundation depth recommendations, and recommendations for temporary excavations and permanent slope stability. A Phase I environmental report identifies recognized environmental conditions of the subject property. A historical review of the site and site activities is conducted to determine the environmental condition of the property. If a Phase I evaluation indicates a potential for contamination, a Phase II site assessment involving sampling and testing would be recommended. The cost of a Phase II evaluation is not included in this proposal. Lenoir County has a 90-day option-to-purchase agreement on lots adjacent to the Lenoir County Courthouse for proposed jail construction. Geotechnical and Phase I environmental reports need to be performed on the lots prior to the County exercising its option-to-purchase agreement on the lots. Froehling & Robertson, Inc. and KCI Associates, both of Raleigh, N.C., provided the County with the least expensive proposals to provide Geotechnical and Phase I environmental report on the lots. Upon a motion by Mr. Harper and a second by Mr. Stroud, Item No. 12 was unanimously approved.

Item No. 13A was a Resolution Authorizing Emergency Rental of Off-Road Truck: Hertz Rentals: \$7,825. Mr. Tom Miller, Landfill Director, addressed the Board. Mr. Miller stated the Terex off-road truck owned by the landfill is constantly moving dirt. In July 2008 the Terex off-road truck broke-down, requiring an engine replacement. On July 21, 2008, the Board authorized an engine replacement and brake system repair. A factory-rebuilt engine was ordered and the replacement is in progress. Landfill operations must continue and the landfill director attempted to use a smaller on-road truck to move the fill dirt required each day, but the massive amount of dirt needed was too much of a strain for the smaller truck. To avoid permanent damage to the smaller on-road truck, administration authorized the landfill director to rent an off-road truck to be used at the landfill for up to one (1) month while the repairs are being completed on the Terex off-road truck. The engine replacement and brake system overhaul should be completed in 2-3 weeks. Hertz Rental provided the lowest cost to the County for a one-month rental of an off-road truck for the landfill. Management recommends the emergency rental of this truck from Hertz Rentals for one month at a price not to exceed \$7,825. Upon a motion by Mr. Stroud and a second by Mr. Humphrey, Item No. 13A was unanimously approved.

Item No. 13B was a Resolution Authorizing Purchase of a 1990 Caterpillar 615C Scraper: Davie Grading, Inc.: \$46,000. Mr. Miller stated the landfill currently owns a 1990 Caterpillar 615C scraper. Last week the transmission locked-up and caused the driveshaft to break loose and penetrate the transmission housing. The hole in the transmission housing can not be repaired. The landfill director has contacted suppliers to acquire a new rebuilt transmission. The cost of a new rebuilt transmission is \$30,000 plus labor to install. The scraper is in constant use leveling; grading the landfill property, and hauling fill dirt to all areas of the landfill facility. In the past 2 years, the scraper has been overhauled except for the transmission. Landfill operations must continue. The cost of a newer scraper (2000 – 2006 model) ranges from \$200,000 to \$550,000.

A used 1990 Caterpillar 615C scraper identical to the model currently owned by the landfill was located in High Point NC. A picture of this scraper is attached. The landfill director went to High Point last week to operate the scraper. The scraper in High Point had \$25,000 in engine work done within the past 60 days. The chains are 90% good, the brakes are new, the tires (which cost \$2,500-\$3,000 each) are almost new, and the transmission has just been serviced. The scraper has only about 25 hours of use since all repair and service work has been completed. Comparing the cost of replacing the transmission on the scraper owned by the landfill to purchasing this scraper in High Point, the landfill director feels that the purchase of the used scraper is in the best interest of the landfill. This scraper can be used immediately or parts can be interchanged on either unit as the landfill expands, the transmission may need to be replaced on the existing scraper and return it to service. The transmission on the 1990 Caterpillar 615C scraper owned by the landfill needs to be replaced at a cost of \$30,000 plus labor. The landfill director has located an identical used scraper in High Point for \$46,000 delivered. The engine on the unit in High Point has recently been rebuilt and other expensive parts replaced and serviced. The tires are almost new. It is ready to be placed in service. Parts are interchangeable between the two scrapers. The scraper in High Point can be used now and delay the replacement of the transmission on the existing unit. Upon a motion by Mr. Taylor and a second by Mr. Harper, Item No. 13B was unanimously approved.

Item No. 14A was a Resolution Approving Deeds to the State of North Carolina. Mr. Jarman stated the City of Kinston and the County of Lenoir deeded property at the former Kinston Regional Airport to the State of North Carolina on June 21, 1988 (Deed Book 881 Page 777) for the purpose of constructing a new National Guard Armory. The City of Kinston and the County of Lenoir also deeded property to the North Carolina Global TransPark Authority on March 6, 1995 (Deed Book 1022 Page 469) for the purpose of constructing the Mountain Air Cargo Facility. Both of the land transactions reserved the right to reversionary interest in the event the grantees failed to construct the specified facilities. The State of North Carolina has constructed a National Guard Armory on Dobbs Farm Road and therefore the property at the former Kinston Regional Airport transferred by deed dated June 21, 1988 is no longer needed for an Armory site. Also the Mountain Air Cargo Facility has been constructed on the property deeded to the North Carolina Global TransPark Authority on March 6, 1995 thereby meeting the requirements specified. Since the land specified in each of these transactions is a portion of the 307 acre site needed for Spirit AeroSystems, it is in the best interest of the citizens of Lenoir County to terminate the reversionary rights reserved by both deeds. Upon a motion by Mr. Harper and a second by Ms. Brown, Item No. 14A was unanimously approved.

Item No. 14B was a Resolution Approving Easement to Progress Energy. Item was tabled.



BUDGET AMENDMENT TO SET UP THE EASTERN REGION FLEX GRANT FOR THE FIELDS CONTROL EXPANSION PROJECT.

Approximately 85% of projects expanding/locating to a community go into an existing building. Lenoir County has historically been very successful with Shell No. 1, now owned and occupied by Lenox China; and Shell No. 2, now owned/occupied by West Pharmaceuticals. Either directly or indirectly, Lenoir County can boast that numerous companies have expanded or relocated to Lenoir County because we had an available building.

The additional tax base that will be created by the up-fitting of this building and the total number of jobs to be created by having another shell building is unknown at this time.

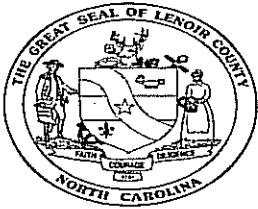

HISTORY / BACKGROUND:

For the past several years the Sheriff's Office has utilized specially trained dogs to detect the presence of narcotics, track fleeing criminals and missing persons, defend the handler and locate items used in connection with crimes. Recently one of the Sheriff's Office K-9's escaped its compound and found its way to a near-by neighbor's property where it was shot. In addition, two other canines have been retired. The county insurance carrier has paid the county \$4000 for the loss of the animal.

EVALUATION:

Southern Police Canine, Inc. has been supplying canines to the Sheriff's Office over the past several years. The Sheriff's Office has negotiated with Southern Police Canine, Inc., to purchase a patrol/narcotics canine for \$12,000 and to retrain two handlers for \$4000. SUBJECT AREA: Financial

ACTION REQUESTED:

The Board is requested to authorize the Sheriff to execute a purchase order with Reliant Management Group to provide equipment and monitoring services for inmates released under the electronic house arrest program.

HISTORY / BACKGROUND:

The Lenoir County Sheriffs Office began electronic monitoring in April of 2007. Currently the North Carolina Department of Corrections provides the personnel and equipment that receives the signal from electronic transmitters that are worn by inmates released to the electronic monitoring program. The Sheriff's Office was recently notified that the NCDOC would no longer provide monitoring services for transmitters that utilize a radio frequency (RF) to transmit a signal. The NCDOC is now transitioning to GPS technology. As a result, the Sheriffs Office was forced to find another vendor who would provide RF based monitoring services. The Sheriffs Office will terminate its contract with the NCDOC effective November 1, 2008.

EVALUATION:

There are a number of businesses that offer both equipment leasing and monitoring services for inmates. Reliant Management Group is a North Carolina based company located in Hillsborough, North Carolina. This business will provide the same monitoring services for the same rate that the NCDOC had provided. The rate is currently \$1.28 per day per inmate. Once, the contract with G4S (business that provides ankle transmitters) has expired Reliant will provide both the transmitters and the monitoring services for the Sheriffs Office. The transmitter costs will remain the same. The lease amount of each transmitter is \$1.45 per day per inmate. The total anticipated costs are \$ 11,500.

The Sheriff respectfully requests that the Sheriff be permitted to execute a purchase order with Reliant Management Group to provide equipment and monitoring services for the Lenoir County Sheriff's Office.

SUBJECT AREA: Financial

ACTION REQUESTED:

The Board is requested to authorize the Sheriff to execute a purchase order with Visionair for the purchase and installation of field based reporting software.

HISTORY / BACKGROUND:

The Sheriffs Office currently utilizes a Visionair product to manage all of its in-house records. These records consist of arrest reports, incident reports, civil documents, jail documents, etc. Incident and arrest reports are entered by officers who have to travel to the Sheriffs Office and input the data using a desktop computer. Once entered, the data is saved on a server for quick retrieval and long term storage. The current procedure for data entry takes the officer out of service and out of the community while the deputy enters data into the records management system (RMS) at the courthouse.

EVALUATION:

Visionair provides a product that allows officers to perform data entry by utilizing their in-car mobile data terminals (MDT). Instead of the officer having to drive to the Sheriffs Office to enter the data, the officer can manually enter the information using their MDT. Once entered the officer can then save the data to a portable memory device and upload the data at the Sheriffs Office at a later time. Having this option allows the officer to remain in the community while completing their reports. This will provide officers with more time to serve civil and criminal papers and keeps them away from the courthouse where crime is not occurring. The quoted price for the purchase and installation of this software is \$37,322. The Sheriff intends to utilize civil process funds, which will not impact the general fund.

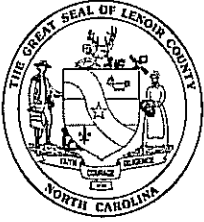

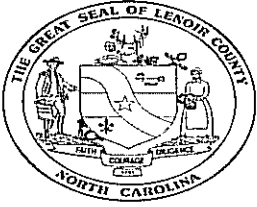

Resolution Authorizing Execution of an Addendum to the Sales Tax Audit Contract Dated October 18, 2004 with
Tax Reduction Specialists: Sales Tax Re-allocation Audit

SUBJECT AREA: Financial

ACTION REQUESTED: The Board is requested to authorize the County Manager to execute an addendum to the contract with Tax Reduction Specialists (a division of Utilities Reduction Specialists, Inc.) to conduct a sales tax re-allocation analysis audit of sales and use tax refund claims for Lenoir County for tax filing periods from December 31, 2008 through December 31, 2009.

HISTORY/BACKGROUND: Utilities Reduction Specialists, Inc., was established in 1991 in Clemmons, North Carolina, with an objective to audit telecommunication and energy bills for billing errors. Utilities Reduction Specialists, Inc., acquired Tax Reduction Specialists in 2001. Tax Reduction Specialists focuses specifically on minimizing client's tax liabilities, conducting sales tax re-allocation audits, and securing refunds. Utility Reduction Specialists, Inc., has worked with 107 city and county governments in 4 states and is currently conducting sales tax re-allocation audits for 19 counties in North Carolina. Lenoir County contracted with Tax Reduction Specialists in October 2002 to audit the sales and use tax refund claims for tax filings in 1999 through June 2002. This time frame was significant because a three (3) year statute of limitations applies to requests for tax refunds and Lenoir County would not have been able to apply for any sales tax refunds for filings through June 1999. The County extended the contract with Tax Reduction Specialists on October 18, 2004 to include sales tax filings through December 31, 2003, on February 7, 2005 to include sales tax filings through December 31, 2006, on March 5, 2007 to include sales tax filings through December 31, 2007, and on February 18, 2008 to include sales tax findings through December 31, 2008. The requested addendum will extend the contract with Tax Reduction Specialists to include sales tax filings through December 31, 2009.

A sales tax re-allocation audit involves identifying the actual county that received credit for the county sales tax on the original sale of merchandise and verifying that the sales tax is credited to the correct county by the N.C. Department of Revenue. Conducting a re-allocation audit is the **only** way that a county can obtain a refund for improperly reported sales tax. The State of North Carolina **will not** do this for a county.

Tax Reduction Specialists, in the original agreement, was compensated 25% of the amount of the sales tax refund obtained by Lenoir County as a result of the sales tax re-allocation audit. Under subsequent addendums and the proposed addendum, the County compensates Tax Reduction Specialists at a reduced rate of **20%** of the sales tax refund obtained by the County. If the county does not receive a refund, there will be no fee for the services of Tax Reduction Specialists. The County does not have the staff or the expertise to do this work in-house.

EVALUATION: Execution of this agreement will provide Lenoir County with the assurance that it has properly received credit for sales tax re-allocations from the North Carolina Department of Revenue for filings through December 31, 2009 and secure any refunds due to the County for improperly filed or credited sales tax revenues. To date, the audit performed by Tax Reduction Specialists has produced a direct benefit to Lenoir County of \$381,424 in additional sales tax revenues that were allocated incorrectly by the State of North Carolina. Tax Reduction Specialists has estimated an additional benefit to the County of \$46,668 through the tax filing period ending December 31, 2008 and additional revenues for filings through December 31, 2009.

Approval of this resolution will allow Tax Reduction Specialists to continue their audit of prior sales tax filings and continue to audit sales tax filings through December 31, 2009.

Resolution Approving Engineering Services for Limited Phase II Environmental Report on Parking Lots for Proposed Jail Construction: KCI Associates: \$3,400

SUBJECT AREA: Purchases / Bids

ACTION REQUESTED:

The Board is requested to approve an engineering services proposal for a limited Phase II environmental report on parking lots for proposed jail construction from KCI Associates in an amount not to exceed \$3,400.

HISTORY/BACKGROUND:

On August 4, 2008, the Board approved a 90-day option- to-purchase agreement on lots adjacent to the Lenoir County Courthouse for proposed jail construction. Before exercising the option-to-purchase agreement, the County must determine if the lots are suitable for construction of a jail facility. On September 15, 2008 the Board approved a resolution to proceed with Geotechnical reports and a Phase I environmental report. Geotechnical reports may include, but are not limited to, description of proposed construction and anticipated structural loads, site subsurface conditions, soil borings, test pits, groundwater conditions, requirements for fill/backfill, foundation depth recommendations, and recommendations for temporary excavations and permanent slope stability. A Phase I environmental report identifies recognized environmental conditions of the subject property. A historical review of the site and site activities is conducted to determine the environmental condition of the property. If a Phase I evaluation indicates a potential for contamination, a Phase II site assessment involving sampling and testing would be recommended. The Phase I report conducted by KCI Associates revealed the existence of a former undocumented underground gasoline storage tank on the subject property. KCI Associates recommends that the soil and groundwater should be investigated to determine whether petroleum impacts are present. A brief summary copy of their Phase I investigation is attached.

EVALUATION:

Lenoir County has a 90-day option-to-purchase agreement on lots adjacent to the Lenoir County Courthouse for proposed jail construction. Geotechnical and Phase I environmental reports need to be performed on the lots prior to the County exercising it's option-to-purchase agreement on the lots. As a result of the Phase I environmental assessment, KCI Associates found the existence of a former undocumented underground gasoline storage tank on the subject property. KCI Associates recommends that a limited Phase II environmental assessment of the soil and groundwater be performed on the subject property to determine whether petroleum impacts are present.

Approval of this resolution will allow for the encumbrance of funds and payment upon completion of the work performed.

Executive Summary

Lenoir County retained KCI Associates of North Carolina, P.A. (KCI) to perform a Phase I Environmental Site Assessment (ESA) for the property identified as the Bowen Property Site located on S. Queen Street and E. Caswell Street in Kinston, North Carolina. The site is comprised of five parcels that occupy approximately 0.92-acres. Two parcels contain buildings. The parcel at 110/112 S. Queen Street contains an approximately 27,000 square feet (ft²) three story former hotel with first floor offices. The parcel at 111 E Caswell Street contains an approximately 6,000 ft² two story office building currently occupied by Integrity Ministries. Both buildings are connected to public utilities. The remaining three parcels are asphalt parking lots. This report was prepared in general accordance with KCI Proposal: *Proposal Phase I Environmental Site Assessment, Future Lenoir County Jail, Kinston, North Carolina*, dated August 28, 2008; ASTM Standard E 1527-05: "Standard Practice for Environmental Site Assessments: Phase I Environmental Site Assessment Process;" and the United States Environmental Protection Agency "All Appropriate Inquiries" Final Rule. This summary is intended as an overview of the Phase I ESA and does not include the full findings and conclusions of the complete report. This ESA did not include a building assessment of mechanical systems, the presence of asbestos-containing material, or the presence of lead-based paint.

The subject property is in downtown Kinston, North Carolina and is "L" shaped. The current building at 110/112 S. Queen Street is a former hotel that was constructed in approximately 1906. The first floor has been renovated and is currently being used for offices. The second and third floors have not been renovated and are being used for storage. The building is currently called "Courthouse Square." The rear of the building abuts an asphalt parking lot and the other building at 111. E. Caswell Street. The current building at 111 E. Caswell was constructed in approximately 1950. Both of the parcels containing buildings contained previous structures that were present as early as 1895. One of the parcels that is currently asphalt parking previously contained a bakery. The site is bordered by other commercial/retail offices and the Lenoir County Courthouse.

No evidence of environmental impairment was observed during the site reconnaissance. Mr. Charles Bowen, the current owner of the property, reported that a 500-gallon gasoline underground storage tank (UST) was installed in the parking lot behind the building at 111 E. Caswell Street in the early 1970s and was removed in the late 1970's. Review of records at the North Carolina Department of Environment and Natural Resources indicate the tank was not permitted as there are no records of installation or removal. Therefore, there is no documentation on the condition of the tank upon removal or if petroleum impacts were present in surrounding soil.

A review of the environmental database search provided by EDR, Inc. indicated the subject property is not listed in any environmental databases. However, several nearby sites are listed as having registered underground storage tanks, including the Lenoir County Courthouse. None of the properties in the immediate vicinity have documented environmental impairment, therefore; they do not present an environmental risk.

This assessment has revealed the following REC in connection with this property:

- Former un-permitted 500-gallon gasoline underground storage was removed without documentation

Based on the findings of this Phase 1 ESA, KCI recognizes the need for additional investigation on this site as follows:

- Soil and groundwater quality should be investigated to determine whether petroleum impacts are present from the former gasoline underground storage tank.

Scope and Cost Estimate for Limited Phase II investigation

KCI will collect soil samples from 3 locations in the area of the former UST. The soil samples will be collected using direct-push technology and screened for organic vapors on two-foot intervals using a photoionization detector (PID). The borings will be advanced to the water table. If elevated PID readings are recorded or visual impacts are present, KCI will collect a soil sample for laboratory analysis. The samples will be analyzed for gasoline-range total petroleum hydrocarbons by USEPA Method 8015/5030. Up to three samples will be collected for laboratory analysis. One groundwater sample will be collected from the boring with highest PID reading (assuming the water table can be reached via direct-push). The groundwater sample will be collected from the open borehole and will be analyzed for volatile organic compounds (VOCs) by USEPA Method 8260 and semi-VOCs by USEPA Method 8270. Upon receipt of the analytical results, KCI will prepare a letter report summarizing the field investigation and the laboratory analysis.
